Four Day Week Trial

A three-month trial of a four-day week could begin in January for desk-based staff at South Cambridgeshire District Council – as a similar pilot of over 3,300 staff continues at more than 70 UK organisations.

As part of the trial, the Council would also look to extend the hours that it is open to the public via a soon-to-be-launched webchat service or Teams / Zoom meetings.

The proposals that will be discussed at the Council's Cabinet meeting on Monday 12 September 2022 recommend that a three-month trial for desk-based staff takes place between January and March 2023. There are around 470 staff at the Council who would be able to take part. There would be a three-month planning period beforehand. If successful, a trial of the Council's blue-collar workers, such as bin collection crews, would follow later next year.

ZCC GrantsTwelve exciting community projects in South Cambridgeshire, aimed at reducing carbon emissions and engaging communities on climate change, are set to receive grant funding totalling £120,544 from the District Council.The Zero Carbon Communities grants, awarded by South Cambridgeshire District Council, are part of its vision to help the district become net zero carbon by 2050, to create a greener future for local people.This is the fourth round of grants since they were established in May 2019. More than £400,000 has been allocated to 61 different grass roots projects including campaigns and awareness-raising around reducing carbon emissions, tree planting, energy efficient heating and lighting, food production and distribution, and waste reduction Grants awarded are here:

The GCP has published their proposals for enhanced bus service and a Cambridge congestion charge. Example of the works include improving energy efficiency and/or replacing older or inefficient heating systems with new low carbon heating options such as air source heat pumps.

	b.	Wellcome Trust Campus Development. Latest updates on the development. Improvement works along the A1301- a map was available showing the various proposals for the A1301. This shows various plans such as 2 bridges, new and upgraded junctions, carriageway realignment; new footways/cycleway, pedestrian crossing points; lighting, surface water drainage infrastructure; utilities and infrastructure works; improvements to existing agricultural accesses; associated engineering and land remodelling and tree removal , including the demolition of existing close boarded timber fence and replacement with metal estate railing and brick and flint wall. It was agreed that we could not comment on the original application as this did not include the 2 bridges, comments could not be made as the bridges would alter the existing application. Meetings with Urban and Civic would be arranged and a response to the application submitted-this will be on the Hinxton PC website shortly.						
		There will be a Community Engagement presentation held by Urban and Civic on the 19 th Oct in the Village Hall between 6 and 8pm, it is hoped that residents will take advantage of attending this meeting to raise any comments or queries on the development.						
	c.	Village Hall extension- Nothing new to report, the next amount of money will be released once building work begins, probably in 2024. Work can begin on the Village Hall prior to this date but it would mean handing over the development to Wellcome with minimal input from the Village.						
	d.	Local Wellcome matters: Liaison meeting, Wetlands Committee. Next Wetlands meeting due to be held on Weds 28 th Sept.						
	e.	Playground. The 5 bar gate is beyond economical repair, new gate to be installed. Playground report sent to Kompan to see if anything is covered by warranty.						
	f.	Highways – speed signs-where to locate? Councillors to walk round village and see possible locations of where the sign could be located, can they be put on telegraph poles?						
	g.	Village Hall- repairs and ongoing maintenance. Clerk to chase repairs on the Village Hall. Quotes for Painting exterior of Village Hall had been obtained, it was agreed that the contract be given to A Dellar, Clerk to let him know. When the electric check es done, it was suggested that the circuit board be replaced, approx. cost of £1000, however it was decided that this would be best done when the Hall is extended as it wasn't urgent.						
	h.	A505 Report- Whittlesford Sation to be looked at along with a new survey of the A505 and the possibility of opening J9 of the M11 to both ways entry and exit.						
	i.	Aggregate site in Gt Chesterford. Enforcement notice has been issued, however the permit seems to be still live, it is unclear who actually owns the site.						
	j.	Gigaclear Network Build. CG reported that she had spoken to them, superfast fibre to be installed, probably in Q1 next year, most of the infrastructure is in place, some still to be eg Duxford Rd. This will include all of Hinxton but not Hinxton Grange.
