The Cllr Awards are the only national awards to celebrate the vital contributions of local councillors across England and Wales.

Updates

- a. Parish Review- nothing done yet, will be revisited next year.
- b. Wellcome Trust Campus Development.
A meeting was held at the Village Hall on the 19th Oct which was very well attended. The presentation by Urban and Civic showed the latest plans, including the new roundabout and two bridges to allow access to the new site. There was a lot of discussion about these bridges and so another Community meeting is scheduled on the 30th Nov at 6pm to discuss this in more detail.
The Highway improvement plans are thought to be premature, as if the bridges go ahead, then these plans will need to be refigured, including crossing points. The sight line of the Northerly bridge is not good. The new roundabout is not in the right place as this will make turning right out of the village difficult. Many residents at the meeting thought that New Road should exit at a roundabout.
U & C did seem receptive to helping the village with traffic calming measures and also trying to stop HGVs using the village as a cut through.
If any villagers see HGVs coming from Duxford in particular, it is asked that a photo and details sent to the Clerk
- c. Village Hall extension. It was picked up that U&C said that Hinxton could use the Sec 106 money for upgrade as well as extension, this to be clarified. The money is index linked so there should be no loss of money if not used straight away.
- d. Local Wellcome matters: Wetlands Committee. CW was unable to attend but will forward Minutes of the meeting once received,
- e. Playground Quote received for repairs needed-£3447.75 This was agreed on and Clerk will arrange for work to be carried out.
- f. Highways /LHI- speed signs- Wellcome are saying that they will look into introducing speed calming measures, so we wait before applying for Local Highways Initiative money for this. Clerk to reapply for Hunts Lane one direction traffic coming into the village plus speed reduction to 20mph.
- g. Village Hall- repairs and ongoing maintenance. This is now underway. Clerk queried the Insurance that Village Hall Committee had in place as this was also covered by the Insurance that PC have taken out – check that we are not doubling up.
- h. A505 Report- awaiting report from next meeting. There will be crash barrier work carried out along there shortly, between M11 and Hunts Road. It was asked why we were not notified of the M11 closure, as has happened in the past, as Hinxton is again being used as a cut-through with very long queues on the A1307.
- i. Aggregate site in Gt Chesterford. Still ongoing, it was suggested that we write to them again with our objections.
- j. Gigaclear Network Build- this should be available in the first quarter of next year.

New items for discussion and correspondence.

Proposed 40mph Speed limit A1307 from 90m north of New Road southwards to 45m north-west of M11 northbound slip roads roundabout. Respond by 30th Nov to say that we support the 40mph but think that 30mph should be considered.

1. Letter received asking for barb wire to be removed from permissive paths as dangerous. Clerk to write to Bidwells to ask for the fence to be repaired as many parts are leaning into the path, the barb wire is necessary to keep the livestock in the field and to stop them leaning over the fence.
2. Letter received asking why ford closed and can residents be notified when gates closed and reopened.
Clerk to contact Highways as this is a problem, the Road Closed signs are no longer put in position when the gates are closed, and to ask if the flip down signs either side of the Ford could be moved into a useful position to stop people driving down the road and only seeing the gates are shut at the last moment.
3. Letter received asking if access for horse riders can be included in Wellcome plans.
This will be forwarded to U & C.
4. Letter received asking if a forum such as Facebook could be set up so that residents can talk about Wellcome plans.
This was discussed and decided that as we have a Hinxton Life Facebook page, this should be sufficient, as well as the Parish Council meeting where residents can come and have their say and see what plans are. Parish Councillors were not keen on having a PC Facebook page.
