





With school holidays approaching and more people spending time near home, I would like to remind you of the walk routes that are on the Society's website and free to download and print. Over the last year or so, we have been steadily increasing the number of recommended routes. We now offer more than 75 routes covering some 400 miles in total with little repetition. Soon, each of the hundred parishes will feature in at least one walk. Most routes have a mixture of countryside and town or village. There is a good range of distances, from 1 mile upwards. Station walks start and finish at railway stations and all others start and finish at a suitable place to park.

Our aim is to help residents and visitors to easily enjoy the area. The routes are planned so as to use good paths and quiet lanes, and to achieve an interesting mix of scenery. The descriptions seek to ensure that nobody will get lost and also to provide sufficient information along the way to make the outing interesting. The area's abundance of public rights of way, its gentle natural beauty and wealth of listed buildings make this possible. Many walks pass or finish near a pub or tea room, thankfully now open again.

While we can plan the route to pass through attractive countryside and villages, we can't predict what pleasures nature may have in store: perhaps majestic cloud formations, the sights and sounds of birds, the variety of butterflies and insects, the scale of badger diggings, deer prints, even a glimpse of a hare or fox or herd of deer. The seasons bring changes to trees, crops, wayside flowers and fruits. With such potential, each walk can be an adventure. We encourage you to carry a camera.

After Lockdown: A Guided Visit to Milton Country Park Wednesday 9 June 6pm - 8pm



Created from former gravel and sand extraction pits the Milton Country Park was originally managed by South Cambridgeshire
District Council for fifteen years. When funding was capped in 2005 the council had to look at ways to cut the cost of running
the park and the decision was taken to outsource its management. Following a competitive market testing process Cambridge
Sport Lakes Trust was selected to take over the management of the park and a 99 year lease was signed in 2008.

CVF invites you to join a summer's evening walk led by Sarah Harris who is deputy manager of the Country Park and project manager of the proposed 2-mile long multipurpose Sports Lake between the park and Waterbeach. We hope to learn about issues relating to the management of the park's open spaces in relation to water, for the benefit of people and wildlife. Of particular interest might be the zonation of the park and what interventions have been made. There may be an opportunity to view the southern end of the land intended for the Sports Lake.

There is no charge but the party will be restricted to 20. Booking in advance is essential. If you fall into one of the cohorts 7 to 12, please ring 119 or go to https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/ where you can directly book your first dose appointment at a central vaccination centre.

If you need to book your second dose, NHS England guidelines state that patients should return to the venue where they had their first vaccination, as the second dose will be allocated and sent to that original venue.

Friday 28th May – A Pint of Alton Wahlburg + Burger Night Menu (amongst other favourites) Our favourite Norfolk busker returns to entertain us


Friday 18th June – A Pint of Harri Beasley + Pie & Steak Night (amongst other favourites)
